Conference Objectives:

Dot Weir, RN, CWON, CWS will:

1. Describe the importance that a comprehensive patient and wound assessment play in creating a meaningful treatment plan.
2. Discuss the most common barriers to wound healing.
3. Explain the role that wound bed preparation has in overcoming the barriers to healing.
4. Describe exciting new therapies and uncommon approaches to wound care including stem cell or biologics and different types of debridement methods.
5. Briefly review the effects of common medications on wound conditions (e.g. steroids, anti-inflammatory meds, chemotherapy)

Michael Van Dyke, JD will:

1. Describe the importance of clear communication with fellow healthcare team members and how this directly impacts patients' lives.
2. Explain how medical information is viewed from a legal perspective.
3. Illustrate examples of malpractice cases for the purpose of education.

Karen Zulkowski, DNS, RN will:

1. Discuss the principle issues associated with the management process of ostomy care.
2. Discuss the several mechanisms of action of Active Leptospermum Honey that optimize wound management.
3. Describe and distinguish the factors of Active Leptospermum Honey and the clinical benefits of continual vs. intermittent debridement for optimal moist wound healing.
4. Describe the mechanisms of super absorbent polymer (SAP) technology and how they allow for greater fluid handling and moisture management.

Objectives for Break Out Sessions: The participant will:

1. Understand the differences in wound treatment goals for a patient at the end of life and identify at least one intervention.
2. Identify at least two interventions in the management of tubes and devices.
3. Identify at least two ostomy tips in caring for a patient with a bowel or urinary diversion.
4. Identify at least two factors to include in the assessment of bowel or urinary incontinence.
5. Describe the proper techniques for dressing a wound with a sinus tract and undermining utilizing NPWT.
6. Identify and stage according to the National Pressure Ulcer Advisory Panel (NPUAP) changes in terminology from pressure ulcer to pressure injury and updates to the stages of pressure injury.
7. Evaluate the role of pH on cellular events in the wound healing process
8. Compare healing of wounds in an acidic environment vs an elevated alkaline environment
9. Explore the effects of lowered wound pH in aiding wound healing by reducing protease activity and increasing fibroblast activity and oxygen release
10. Review studies associating the use of active leptospermum honey in altering surface pH in wounds and reducing wound size

Speakers' Biography

Dot Weir, RN, CWON, CWS

Dot has been a registered nurse for 39 years; 35 of those dedicated to the practice of wound and ostomy care. She has practiced in acute care, home care, and long-term care, spent 7 years in industry, and has practiced in outpatient care since 2001. She is board certified in wound and ostomy care since 1985 and holds a second certification as wound specialist from The American Board of Wound Management. She practices outpatient wound management at Osceola Regional Medical Center in Kissimmee, Florida and at Health Central Hospital in Ocoee, Florida.

Dot is the Co-Chair of the Symposium on Advanced Wound Care, a faculty member of the Wound Certification Prep Course, national lecturer and has authored many journal articles and book chapters.

Michael J. Van Dyke, J.D.

Mr. Van Dyke obtained Bachelor of Science in Commerce from Santa Clara University in Santa Clara in 1989, and graduated from Loyola of Los Angeles school of Law. He studied business education in Japan and worked for Ricoh Corporation upon his return to the U.S.

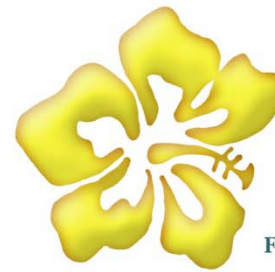
Description of the Break Out Sessions
